

Principal's Report

1. Technology

- a. The 30 teacher laptops we ordered last week have arrived. We will be placing another order to replace all existing staff laptops, so we will start next school year with all new teacher technology.

2. OSIs

- a. Mission Specific Goal: *75% of students, enrolled on the 40th and 120th day, will complete at least 18 OSIs and earn a minimum of a 3 on the RACED writing OSI Assignment Rubric on the final assignment for the year.*

3. Testing

- a. NM-ASR make-up tests were conducted for 5th and 8th graders last week. We have completed all tests, with 100% participation.
- b. The DLM alternate assessment was conducted last week, as well.
- c. NM-MSSA tests started this week and will continue into next week. We completed the Math assessment for all students this week (Monday and Tuesday for Middle School students, Wednesday and Thursday for Elementary students). We will use the same schedule next week for the ELA assessment. Make-up tests will take place on Fridays as well as the week of April 29th.
 - i. We changed our typical test scheduling this year in response to our ongoing emphasis on Math instruction. Our students have historically not performed as well in Math as in ELA, so we decided to start our testing

cycle with Math and to have a week's break between each subject in an effort to ease testing fatigue.

- d. The final testing window of the school year will be our Spring MAPs which takes place the week of May 13th. Once that is completed and our teachers have analyzed the data I will present our final results to the GC.
